The debut of Head Coach Agnus Berenato did not go as planned as the Pittsburgh women's basketball team could not overcome a poor shooting night from the field, dropping a 75-61 decision to visiting Coppin State on Nov. 25 at the Petersen Events Center. The Panthers fell to 0-1 while the Lady Eagles (1-1) notched their first win of the year.

In a foul-laden first half, Pittsburgh opened the game by taking a 9-4 advantage four minutes into the game. Coppin State came back and grabbed an 18-16 lead, following a 14-7 spurt over the next seven minutes.

Jessica Allen drilled a 3-pointer at the 4:55 mark of the first half to give the Panthers a 31-26 lead, but the Lady Eagles fought back and held a narrow 39-37 halftime margin.

The Lady Eagles came out on fire in the second half and went on a game-clinching 17-4 run in the first seven minutes thanks to eight points from Leisel Harry. Pittsburgh would close the gap to nine points (62-53) at the 7:30 mark of the game, but the lead ballooned back to 21 points, 74-53, in the closing minutes to seal the fate of the Panthers.

Pittsburgh shot just 33 percent (19 of 58) from the field in the game and made only 3-of-10 shots from behind the 3-point arc. Coppin State hit 49 percent (30 of 61) of its shots from the field and 15-of-20 shots from the charity stripe.

Latoya Kincaid posted her first career double-double, finishing with 14 points and 11 rebounds. Bridget Larkin had a career-high 13 points, while Allen tallied 11 points. Harry led all scorers with 23 points for the Lady Eagles.

Agnus Berenato got her first win as the Panthers' women's basketball coach as the University of Pittsburgh defeated visiting Central Connecticut State, 75-59, on Nov. 28 at the Petersen Events Center.

Pittsburgh (1-1) jumped out to an early 15-2 lead five minutes into the game thanks to an offensive outburst. Amy Kunich and Jessica Allen each hit a 3-pointer during the stretch while Alisha Morris pitched in four points on two layups.

Central Connecticut State (1-2) clawed its way back into the game on a pair of 3-pointers from Kerrin Fesik and closed the gap to seven points, 33-26, by halftime.

Both teams shot the ball well in the first half as Pittsburgh hit 47 percent (14 of 30) from the field and 46 percent (5 of 11) from behind the arc. The Blue Devils made 10-of-23 field goals (44 percent) and an impressive 71 percent (5 of 7) from 3-point land.

Pittsburgh opened the second half on a 12-3 run to take a 45-29 advantage at the 15:42 mark. Latoya Kincaid provided the spark with eight points during the stretch.

Just when the Panthers thought they had the game in control, Central Connecticut State pulled to within five, 60-55, with seven minutes remaining. However, Pittsburgh buckled down and scored 15 of the game's final 19 points to capture the first win of the 2003-04 season.

Pittsburgh shot 59 percent (32 of 54) from the field in the game, including an amazing 75 percent (18 of 24) in the second half. The Blue Devils finished 44 percent (20 of 46) from the field, but connected on 69 percent (9 of 13) from behind the arc.

Pittsburgh's women's basketball team suffered a disappointing 96-44 setback to seventh-ranked Penn State on Dec. 14 at the Bryce Jordan Center. The Panthers fell to 1-4 on the season while the Lady Lions improved to 7-1.

A jumper by Stacy Moore at the 18:19 mark of the first half gave Pittsburgh a 6-5 lead, but that was short-lived. Penn State scored 15 unanswered points over the next three-and-a-half minutes to take a 20-6 advantage, thanks to eight points from Kelly Mazzante.

The lead ballooned to as many as 35 points (49-14) later in the half and the Lady Lions went to halftime with a 54-21 lead.

In the first 20 minutes, Pittsburgh hit 43 percent from the field (9 of 21) but allowed Penn State to hit 51 percent (18 of 35) of its field goals, including 4 of 7 from behind the 3-point arc.

In the second half, the Panthers continued to struggle and found itself down 53 points late in the game. Pittsburgh could not overcome its inexperience and suffered the worst loss in the series history with Penn State.

For the game, the Panthers connected on 39 percent (15 of 39) from the field while the Lady Lions hit 50 percent (31 of 62) of their field goals. Pittsburgh was unable to hit a 3-pointer, missing all seven attempts. Penn State made 7-of-15 shots from 3-point range.

Latoya Kincaid had a team-high 16 points for Pittsburgh, hitting a perfect 5-of-5 from the field and 6-of-7 from the charity stripe.

Mazzante led four Lady Lions in double figures, finishing with 31 points.

**NOTES:** Pittsburgh trails the all-time series at Penn State, 14-1...the Panthers finished with just 22 rebounds while the Lady Lions pulled down 42...Moore made her first career start in place of the injured Amy Kunich. Moore finished with a career-high (tied) eight points, hitting 3-of-4 shots from the field.

Jessica Allen and Latoya Kincaid each poured in 17 points and Jennifer Brown recorded her first career double-double as Pittsburgh's women's basketball team snapped a three-game losing streak with a convincing 64-44 victory at Norfolk State on Dec. 17. The Panthers improved to 2-4 while the Spartans dropped to 1-7.

After falling behind 4-0, Pittsburgh went on a 9-0 run and began to put the defensive clamp on Norfolk State's offense. The Panthers, who gave up just four points during a seven-minute span midway through the first half, stretched their lead to as many as 12 points (26-14) before taking a 26-16 halftime advantage.

In a sloppy first 20 minutes, Pittsburgh committed 17 turnovers and forced 18 Spartan miscues. Both teams shot 32 percent from the field (8 of 25), but the Panthers hit 10-of-11 foul shots while Norfolk State did not attempt a charity shot.

In the second period, Allen caught fire and scored all 17 of her points in the half. She finished 5-of-6 from behind the 3-point arc as Pittsburgh controlled the half, leading by at least nine points throughout while cruising to its second win of the year.

Kincaid hit 5-of-9 field goals and 7-of-8 foul shots for the game. She also added four steals and four rebounds. Brown finished with 13 points and 11 rebounds, both career highs. The freshman collected four steals and made a perfect 5-of-5 shots at the foul line.

For the game, Pittsburgh hit a season-high 91 percent (19 of 21) from the foul line and hit 43 percent (20 of 47) of its field goals. The Panthers outrebounded the Spartans, 38-26, and tallied 17 steals.

Behind another strong performance from senior Latoya Kincaid, the Pittsburgh women's basketball team fought its way to a 62-48 victory over visiting Fordham on New Year's Eve at the Petersen Events Center. The Panthers (4-6) snapped a two-game losing streak while the Rams (6-4) lost for the first time in the last six games.

Kincaid finished with 13 points and 12 rebounds for the Panthers, marking her second double-double of the season. She also added two assists, one block and one steal.

Both teams struggled to get things going to start the game as Pittsburgh held a slim 9-8 lead at the 8:11 mark of the first half. The Panthers then found themselves trailing 18-17 four minutes later before grabbing a 30-23 lead entering halftime.

Fordham cut the lead to 32-30 three minutes into the second half thanks to five quick points by Monica Mack. However, Pittsburgh embarked on a 17-5 run over the next nine minutes to take a convincing 49-35 advantage.

The Rams pulled to within nine points, 57-48, with 40 seconds remaining in the game but the Panthers hit 3-of-4 free throws down the stretch and Jennifer Brown capped the win with a break-away layup with six seconds left.

For the game, the Panthers shot 45 percent (22 of 49) from the field, but managed to make a dismal 44 percent (16 of 36) from the free-throw line. Fordham hit 28 percent (15 of 54) of its field goals, including just 25 percent (5 of 20) from behind the 3-point arc.

Brown finished with 11 points and eight rebounds to complement Kincaid's double-double, while Jessica Allen added 10 points.

Pittsburgh's women's basketball team suffered a 65-58 setback to rival West Virginia in its Big East Conference opener on Jan. 3 at the WVU Coliseum. The Panthers fell to 4-7 overall and 0-1 in the conference, while the Mountaineers improved to 9-3, 1-0 in the Big East.

After falling behind 16-0 in the game's initial five minutes, Pittsburgh clawed its way back throughout the first half. The Panthers used the long ball to get back into contention as Jessica Allen and Danielle Taylor provided the punch as Allen hit four 3-pointers and Taylor drilled three.

Pittsburgh used a 24-9 run, including an 11-0 spurt, to end the half and knot the score at 32-32. The Panthers hit 7-of-15 shots from behind the arc in the first frame, but made just five of their other 20 field goals.

A jumper by Brooke Hughes 13 seconds into the second half gave the Panthers their first lead of the game, 34-32. West Virginia came right back with a 10-3 run to grab a 42-37 advantage at the 15:39 mark.

After two free throws by Latoya Kincaid tied the score at 51-51 with 5:31 remaining, the Mountaineers used a decisive two-minute stretch to cease the momentum. Three consecutive 3-pointers, two by Kate Bulger and one by younger sister Meg Bulger, quickly gave West Virginia a 60-51 lead with just under four minutes remaining.

Pittsburgh closed the gap to four points (60-56) at the 2:10 mark, but a layup by Yolanda Paige and a fade-away jumper by Kate Bulger gave the Mountaineers the victory.

For the game, the Panthers shot 34 percent (21 of 61) from the field, including 40 percent (8 of 20) from 3-point range. West Virginia made 45 percent (24 of 53) of its field goals, including 50 percent (8 of 16) from behind the arc.

Cheron Taylor came off the bench and finished with career-highs of 13 points (6-of-8 shooting) and eight rebounds. Allen added 12 points and Kincaid pitched in 11 points and six boards.

Both teams shot 42 percent from the field, but the Panthers hit 36 percent (5 of 14) from behind the arc to the Friars' 15 percent (2 of 13). Pittsburgh struggled from the free-throw line, making just 7 of 13 (54 percent) while Providence hit 85 percent (11 of 13) from the charity stripe.

Jessica Allen added 12 points on four 3-pointers for the Panthers. Hughes, in her first career start, dished out a career-high six assists to go along with five points.

Brooke Freeburg led the Friars with 14 points.

Miami jumped out to 16-8 at the 12:36 mark of the first half after two free throws from Tatjana Marincic. However, Pittsburgh fought back with a 8-2 run and pulled to within two points, 18-16, midway through the half.

The Hurricanes stretched the lead to 15 points on a layup by Imani Dhahbu and went to the locker room with a 38-24 advantage.

Trailing 53-36 with 10:38 left in the game, Pittsburgh rallied and cut the lead to seven points, 63-56, on two free throws by Latoya Kincaid. The Hurricanes held off the Panthers' rally to earn their fourth straight victory in the series.

Kincaid finished with a game-high 21 points on 7-of-15 shooting and pulled down a team-best eight boards. She scored 19 of her 21 markers in the second half and also added two steals. Jennifer Brown tallied 15 points for Pittsburgh.

Both teams shot 42 percent from the field. Pittsburgh was 22-of-29 (76 percent) from the foul line compared to the Hurricanes' 77 percent (24 of 31) foul shooting.

Pittsburgh's women's basketball team dropped its second straight game to a ranked opponent as it fell to No. 23 Virginia Tech, 67-57, on Jan. 21 at the Petersen Events Center. The Panthers, who fell to then-No. 21 Miami on Jan. 17, dropped to 6-10 overall and 2-4 in the Big East, while the Hokies improved to 14-3 and 3-3 in the conference.

In a back-and-forth first half, there were five lead changes and four ties. Virginia Tech led by four points, 19-15, at the 6:52 mark, but Pittsburgh responded with a 9-0 run to grab a 24-19 lead two minutes later. The Panthers, behind 12 first-half points from Katie Histed, went to the locker room with a slim 27-25 advantage.

Pittsburgh opened the second half on fire and built an eight-point lead (42-34) on a fast-break jumper by Amy Kunich with 13 minutes remaining in the game. However, the Panthers went cold from the field and scored just two points over the next six minutes as Virginia Tech embarked on a 18-2 spurt.

The Panthers pulled to within three points, 58-55, on consecutive free throws by Latoya Kincaid at the 2:19 mark, but the Hokies scored nine of the game's final 11 points to hold off the Pittsburgh rally.

Histed finished with a career-high 19 points (7-of-13 shooting) to lead the Panthers. Kunich, in her first game back since suffering a stress fracture in her left foot early in December, added 10 points as did Kincaid and Sheila Stufflet. Kincaid also pulled down a team-high eight boards.

Carrie Mason tallied 15 points, eight rebounds and seven assists to lead Virginia Tech.

Pittsburgh's women's basketball team suffered its seventh straight loss as it fell to visiting Rutgers, 75-61, on Feb. 11 at the Petersen Events Center. The Panthers dropped to 6-15 overall and 2-9 in the Big East while the Scarlet Knights improved to 14-8 and 6-4 in the conference.

Pittsburgh held a slim 12-11 advantage at the 14:54 mark of the first half as Amy Kunich hit her second 3-pointer of the night. However, Rutgers went on a 16-3 run to take a 27-15 lead and eventually led by seven points, 38-31, at intermission.

The Panthers trimmed the Rutgers' advantage to four points (38-34) as Katie Histed hit a quick 3-pointer to open the second half. Once again, the Scarlet Knights responded and extended its lead to as many as 17 points on two occasions in the last seven minutes of the game before holding on to the 15-point victory, their eighth straight over Pittsburgh in the series history.

Kunich and Latoya Kincaid each tallied 14 points to lead the Panthers. Histed added 11 markers.

Pittsburgh shot 39 percent (18 of 46) from the field in the game and 71 percent (20 of 28) from the foul line. Rutgers, led by Cappie Pondexter's game-high 21 points, hit 49 percent (32 of 65) of its field goals but just 47 percent (8 of 17) from the free-throw line.

Georgetown scored the game's initial eight points thanks to two consecutive 3-pointers by Mary Lisicky. The Hoyas then led by as many as 12 points, 18-6, midway through the first half before Pittsburgh mounted a rally to get back into the contest.

In the second half, Pittsburgh again clawed its way to within four points on separate occasions, but it could never get any closer. A 10-0 Hoya run after the score was 40-36 put the game in Georgetown's control at the 12:59 mark. Pittsburgh's women's basketball team came up just short of knocking off Notre Dame as it fell to the Fighting Irish, 72-68, on Feb. 21 in front of 7,814 at the Petersen Events Center. The Panthers dropped their 10th straight game to fall to 6-18 overall and 2-12 in the Big East, while Notre Dame improved to 17-8 and 10-3 in the conference.

After falling behind by 14 points, 55-41, with just over 16 minutes remaining in the contest, Pittsburgh put the clamps on the Fighting Irish and clawed its way back into the contest. The Panthers went on a 16-3 run over the next eight minutes, capped off by a free throw from freshman Jennifer Brown to pull them to within one point, 58-57.

Notre Dame stretched the lead back to six points, 63-57, but once again Pittsburgh refused to go away. The Panthers eventually grabbed the lead, 68-67, on a desperation 3-pointer by junior guard Amy Kunich. Kunich's 3-pointer hit nothing by nylon as the shot clock expired with 2:18 remaining.

However, the Fighting Irish scored the game's final five points, including 5-of-8 free throws in the final 1:31 of the contest, to pick up the win and stay unbeaten in 14 tries against Pittsburgh in the all-time series.

The Panthers shot 44 percent (27 of 62) from the field and 35 percent (6 of 17) from behind the 3-point arc in the game. The Fighting Irish hit 57 percent (26 of 46) of its field goals and 42 percent (5 of 12) of its 3-pointers.

Notre Dame led 40-37 at the intermission after Pittsburgh took a three-point lead (35-32) with just under two minutes remaining in the first half.

Pittsburgh's upset bid fell short as it suffered a 56-45 setback to No. 23 Villanova on March 2 at the Petersen Events Center. The Panthers finished the season 6-20 overall and 2-14 in the Big East, while Villanova improved to 22-5 and 12-4 in the conference.

In the first half, Pittsburgh fell behind 18-8 after the Wildcats' Kelly Nash hit a 3-pointer at the 12:22 mark. The Panthers closed the gap to four points (23-19) following an 11-5 run thanks to five points from freshman Brooke Hughes. They cut the lead to two points with 2:40 remaining in the half on a jumper by senior Stacy Moore, but Villanova entered the locker room with a four-point advantage, 29-25.

Pittsburgh hit 39 percent (10 of 26) of its field goals in the first half while the Wildcats connected on 48 percent (12 of 25) of its shots.

The Panthers pulled back to within two points on separate occasions early in the second half, but Villanova gradually stretched the lead to double figures midway through the half. The advantage ballooned to a game-high 14 points, 55-41, with 1:10 remaining in the contest as the Wildcats won their fifth straight over Pittsburgh in the series history.

For the game, the Panthers shot 38 percent (18 of 47) from the field and 40 percent (2 of 5) from behind the 3-point arc. Villanova made 44 percent (20 of 46) of its field goals and 32 percent (7 of 22) of its 3-pointers.

Sophomore Cheron Taylor led Pittsburgh with 10 points and five rebounds. Moore finished with a career-high (tied) eight points and also pulled down five boards.

Nash hit four 3-pointers to lead the Wildcats and finished with a game-high 14 points.

**NOTES:** Villanova had 34 rebounds to the Panthers' 27...each team totaled four

steals...Pittsburgh was 7-of-11 (64 percent) from the foul line and the Wildcats were 9-of-16 (56 percent).
