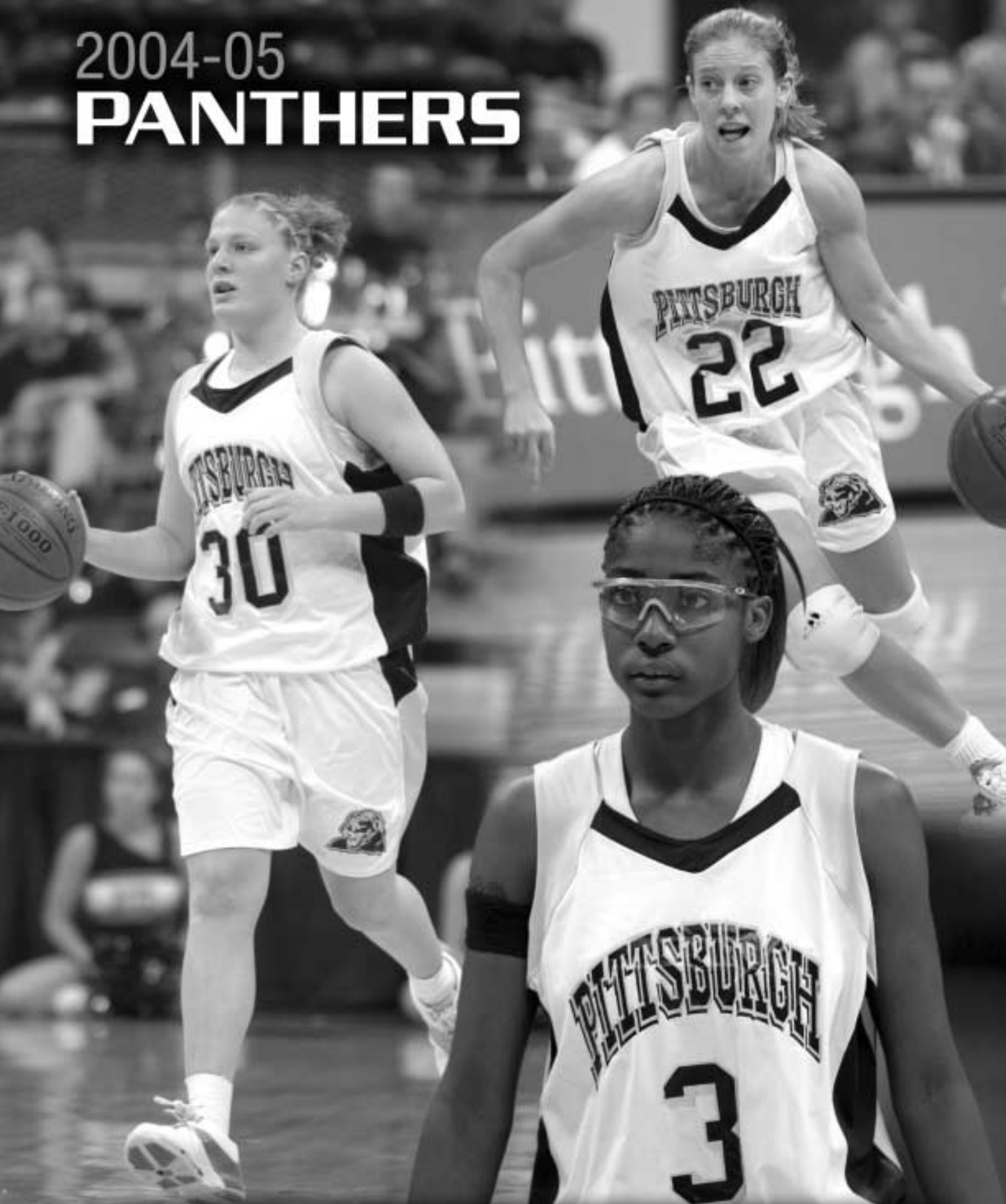

## SEASON PREVIEW

Pittsburgh's women's basketball team is going to win. Whether it's this year or in the very near future, the program will rise again.

Spend five minutes around anyone involved with the Panthers' women's basketball team and you'll quickly get that feeling.

"I came to Pittsburgh with the thought in mind that we are going to make this town and University proud of the Panthers' women's basketball team," second-year head coach Agnus Berenato said. "Since the day I arrived here, I have thought about that non-stop. We are going to be winners here and give everyone in the area a reason to be proud of our women's basketball team."

Even though it may take time, Berenato thinks she has already created winners both on and off the court.

"Last year we may have only won six games, but we were winning in other ways," Berenato said. "To see our student-athletes become young women with respect for not only themselves but their surroundings was a victory in itself. They gave many things to the University and to the community, which made our coaching staff very proud."

With one recruiting class under her belt, Berenato also believes the winning on the court is in the very near future.

"I am so excited about the fine student-athletes that we have recruited to the University of Pittsburgh this year," Berenato said of her first recruiting class. "They have the opportunity of taking our program to become among the elite in the Big East Conference, and I know they are ready for the challenge."

The challenge may appear to be a steep one to climb, but Berenato believes that with the mentality that is permeating throughout not only the team but also in the athletic department, there are many exciting times that lie ahead for the Panthers.

"With our returning players and our outstanding incoming recruiting class, we are quickly making positive things happen for our women's basketball program," Berenato added. "Our players are buying into what we are preaching and it's exciting. Everyone around our program can see it and feel it. It is an exciting time for our team and I can't wait to accomplish what we came to do."

"We have a goal to cut down the nets at the Petersen Events Center, and we are not going to stop trying until we have completed that goal."

## GUARDS

Pittsburgh has the most depth at the guard position heading into this season, led by senior **AMY KUNICH**. A three-year letterwinner who owns 46 career starts, Kunich provides the most experience on a relatively young squad.

"Amy has the experience we are looking for in the guard position," Berenato said. "She has to step up her play in order for us to be successful. Amy has been around the program and knows what to expect so we are going to rely on her to help mold the incoming freshmen into Big East players. She is a leader on the court and is an extension of the coach."

Last season, Kunich suffered a stress fracture in her left foot, shortening her season to only 15 games. She returned to action in the final 11 games, starting eight. Kunich dished out a team-best 53 assists and shot an impressive 94 percent from the foul line. Entering this year, she ranks ninth on the school's all-time list with 247 career assists.

Pittsburgh's top threat from behind the 3-point arc is senior **JESSICA ALLEN**. Last year, Allen had a breakout game in a win at Norfolk State, finishing with a career-high of 17 points and hitting 5-of-9 shots from the 3-point range. A starter in 22 games, Allen missed the final eight games with a stress fracture but appears ready for a breakout senior campaign.

"Jessica has proven she is able to hit the shot from behind the arc and also penetrate through defenses," Berenato said. "She keeps the defense honest with her ability to do both. This is her last season and we are expecting her to give us many threats on the court."

After playing only four games her freshman year, **KATIE HISTED** had a more productive year last season. The 5-foot-10 junior played in 24 games, starting four of the five final contests. She tied or led the team in points in five of the

final eight games, and had a career high 19 points versus Virginia Tech.

"Katie really stepped it up midway through last year and we are looking for big things from her this year again," Berenato said. "She came on at the end of the season and was one of our go-to players. We need her to fill this role again this year and she has done an excellent job in the offseason of getting herself ready to take on an even more prominent role this season."

**BROOKE HUGHES**, who stands 5-foot-8, returns to the floor after seeing action in all 26 games as a freshman. Stepping in for the injured Kunich last year, Hughes started nine games and gained valuable experience that should help the Panthers' backcourt. She finished with 51 assists, second on the team to Kunich.

"Brooke works extremely hard for us and won't back down from anyone despite her size," Berenato said. "She works hard everyday and has a nice 3-point shot. She needs to get quicker and make better judgments for us to win this year. I am confident she will respond."

There is much excitement about Pittsburgh's two incoming freshman guards, **KARLYLE LIM** and **SHAVONTE ZELLOUS**. Both have outstanding credentials coming out of high school and should see significant playing time in their first years at Pittsburgh.

"I am so excited to have both Karlyle and Shavonte joining our program," Berenato said. "They have so much talent and they have the attitude to get us to where we want to be. Even though they are freshmen, we are going to rely heavily on them to make an impact on our program right away."

Lim, who stands 5-foot-8, finished her career at East Chapel Hill High School with 368 assists, 332 rebounds, and 256 steals. She led East Chapel Hill High to an impressive 22-6 record and finished her career with 1,154 points. Lim was also named the Five County Conference Player of the Year and earned all-area recognition as a senior.

"Karlyle was our first commitment last year and she is going to have a major impact in her first season with us," Berenato said. "She has the ability to control the game and has excellent ball-handling skills. She also can take over a game with her scoring ability and her work ethic is something we are looking forward to. Karlyle will be a solid piece of the puzzle we need here at Pittsburgh."

Zellous, a product of Jones High School in Orlando, Fla., averaged over 15 points, 15 rebounds, six assists and five steals as a senior. The four-year captain led the Tigers to an impressive 30-2 record and the state championship her senior year in which she was named MVP of the state

championship game. Zellous earned all-state and all-metro accolades and was a McDonald's All-American nominee.

"Shavonte knows what it takes to be successful and she has already brought that to the rest of the team," Berenato said. "She can drive to the hoop at ease, but also has the ability to run the floor and pull up for a jump shot over a defender. She is an exciting player who should see significant time on the floor as a freshman."

**MALLORIE WINN**, a 5-foot-11 junior transfer from Georgia Tech, has to sit out this year due to NCAA transfer rules. However, she will make an immediate impact next year when she is eligible to play.

"Mallorie is so smooth on the floor and we can't be more excited about her joining us at Pittsburgh," Berenato said. "She is such a complete player, meaning she can pass or score at will. She is the type of player that programs are built around and we are fortunate to have her as a Panther."

## FORWARDS

Pittsburgh returns three forwards from last year's team and adds one of its top recruits as the fourth on the squad. **JENNIFER BROWN**, **CHERON TAYLOR** and **DANIELLE TAYLOR** are all back while incoming frosh standout **VIKA SHOLOKHOVA** joins the Panthers and looks to become an instant spark.

"We are going to look to our forwards for a lot of production this year," Berenato said. "We have depth at this position and with the addition of Vika, we are going to have a strong core of offensive and defensive production."

Leading the cast is Brown, a 6-foot-3 sophomore, who started 10 games last year while playing in 24. She had a career day and recorded her first double-double in the win over Norfolk State last season, finishing with 13 points and 11 rebounds. She also tallied her second double-double with career-highs of 16 points and 13 rebounds against Clemson.

"Jennifer is going to be one of our leaders this year, both on and off the court," Berenato said. "I am looking for her to have an outstanding sophomore year because she has the ability to score any time in the post. She got stronger in the offseason and it shows. Jennifer is very athletic and will provide us with great moves around the basket."

Also returning and figuring to be in the forward mix is 5-foot-11 Cheron Taylor, who played in 25 games last year. She started seven games and posted career highs in points (17) and rebounds (11) in the win over Providence.

"Cheron has really taken the opportunity to get better and she is going to help us out this year," Berenato said. "She has improved her game and

understands what we are looking for from her. She is very athletic and although she is undersized, she is very powerful. She is deceptively quick enough to get by the taller defender."

Danielle Taylor, who enters her second season with the Panthers, will look to provide depth at the forward position.

"Danielle needs to become stronger in order to successfully compete in the Big East," Berenato said. "She is getting better but needs to understand the college game more in order to help us."

One of the top recruits in the entire conference, Sholokhova enters her first season with the Panthers with top-notch credentials. Originally from St. Petersburg, Russia, Sholokhova became one of the country's top prospects the past two years playing at Sacred Heart High in Vineland, N.J.

"Vika is the type of player that can instantly change a program and we are excited about her being here at Pittsburgh," Berenato said. "She is a versatile player who can score outside or inside. She has a good shooting touch and she can also shoot the 3-pointer. We will use her a lot this year and she has the ability to become a dominant player in the Big East."

The 6-foot-4 freshmen led the Lady Lions to an impressive 25-2 record and the conference championship as a junior. Sholokhova averaged 19.6 points and 12.0 rebounds as a senior, and was listed as one of the top 45 players in the country by Nike's Post Summer/Preseason List.

## CENTERS

Returning from last season, **ALLISHA MORRIS** and **BRIDGET LARKIN** will continue to vie for time under the basket, but they will be pushed heavily by incoming freshman **MARCEDES WALKER**.

"Even though Allisha and Bridget have been around our program for the past couple of years, I think Mercedes has the ability to come right in and push them both for significant time on the court," Berenato said. "It will be a battle, but it is nice to have the options of using many bodies under the hoop."

Morris, a 6-foot-3 senior, played in 25 games last season and started nine. She averaged 12 minutes and 3.0 points per game.

"Allisha came on at the end of the year after she brought into what we were trying to teach her," Berenato said. "She has a tremendous presence in the lane and sets very good screens. She can move to either side and make things happen, which we need her to do for us to win games this year."

Larkin, a 6-foot-4 junior, played in 14 contests last year after playing only two games her freshman year. In limited action, she was a perfect 13-of-13 from the free throw line.

"Bridget made great strides from the beginning of the season to the end of the year," Berenato said. "She is a great competitor who is able to rally the troops on the floor. She works hard and defends the post well. Bridget has done a great job rebounding for us and she needs to continue to improve her durability."

Walker, who stands 6-foot-3, hails from Philadelphia and brings a certain attitude to the game which will figure in to the Panthers' post game.

"Mercedes has the skills and the body to become one of the Big East's best post players early in her career," Berenato said. "She has an attitude about her that she won't back down from anyone. We need that kind of person right now and she is a perfect fit. She can score around the hoop at ease and is light on her feet. Even though she has a large frame, Mercedes can move very well and we are excited to see her compete at the college level."

A product of University City High School, Walker averaged 21.9 points and 8.9 rebounds her senior year. As captain, she led University City to three consecutive semifinal appearances and a championship appearance her senior year. Walker also earned McDonald's Honorable Mention All-American honors and attended adidas' top 10 All-American in Georgia.

**JUNIOR SEASON (2003-04)**

Pittsburgh's top threat from behind the 3-point arc, Jessica Allen was a first-year starter in 2003-04... owns 22 career starts, including 18 games as a junior...sat out the final eight games due to a stress fracture in her left foot...led the team with 40 3-pointers (40 of 114)...had a breakout game in the win at Norfolk State...finished with a career-high 17 points, hitting 5-of-9 shots from 3-point range...tallied all 17 points after halftime and was 5-of-6 from behind the arc in the final 20 minutes...also dished out a career-high (tied) four assists and three steals...followed up with 15 points, all on 3-pointers, and added three steals and three assists at Robert Morris...at West Virginia, had 12 points, all on 3-pointers, in 31 minutes...tallied 12 points, including four 3-pointers (4 of 8), and three assists against Providence...in the opener against Coppin State poured in 11 points, including two 3-pointers...also added three rebounds, one assist and one steal in 27 minutes...added 14 points, including four 3-pointers, four assists, three boards and two steals versus Central Connecticut State...totaled 10 points and two assists against Fordham... finished with nine points, including three 3-pointers, against Hartford, Clemson and Syracuse...had 12 points with three treys at St. John's.

**SOPHOMORE SEASON (2002-03)**

After redshirting in 2001-02 due to a leg injury, Allen provided a spark off the bench in her first active season...had four starts at small forward... despite averaging just 11.2 minutes per game, was third on the team in 3-pointers made (23 of 53)...hit 43 percent from behind the arc and 49.5 percent (47 of 95) overall from the field...

made her first career start against Virginia Tech... against the Hokies, tallied a then career-best 11 points with two rebounds and one steal in a personal-high 27 minutes...finished with nine points, all from 3-pointers, in her second start in the win over St. John's...versus Miami, totaled a career-high 14 points on 6-of-12 shooting...also added four rebounds and two assists against the Hurricanes...had 10 points (4-of-6 shooting) in the season opener against Robert Morris...in just five minutes at Xavier, drilled all three of her 3-pointers and finished with nine points...in the upset over Penn State, had a career-high two steals in seven minutes...hit two 3-pointers and finished with eight points at home versus Providence...totaled seven points in 12 minutes versus Furman...finished with 10 points on a perfect 4-of-4 shooting, including 2-of-2 from 3-point land, in the win over WVU...nailed two 3-pointers (four attempts) and finished with six points in 14 minutes at Syracuse...had 10 crucial points off the bench against Seton Hall in the season finale...hit 4-of-5 shots overall, including 2-of-3 shots from 3-point land, and grabbed four rebounds against the Pirates in just 16 minutes.

**FRESHMAN SEASON (2001-02)**

Allen redshirted due to a torn anterior cruciate ligament in the preseason.

**HIGH SCHOOL**

Allen was a first-team all-state honoree at New London High School during her final three years... eclipsed the 1,000-point plateau as a junior... finished her career with over 1,900 points, marking the most points by a female at New London... earned all-conference honors all four years of high school...led her team to the 1998 ECC Conference title...team compiled a 66-14 record during her four years, including an 18-2 mark as a junior... was a member of the 1999 AAU State title team... averaged 20.7 points, 5.5 rebounds, 5.3 assists and 2.8 steals per game as a junior...was a finalist for Connecticut's Player of the Year.

## JUNIOR SEASON (2003-04)

Amy Kunich, the team's lone returning starter in 2003-04, played in 15 games in an injury-shortened campaign...suffered a stress fracture in her left foot the week prior to the Penn State game (Dec. 14) and sat out the following 11 games before returning against Virginia Tech...played in final 11 games, starting the last eight...also started the first four contests of the year...had a team-best 53 assists...shot 33.3 percent (17 of 51) from 3-point range...also hit 94 percent (15 of 16) from the foul line...at home against Virginia Tech, played 22 minutes off the bench and pitched in 10 points (4-of-8 shooting)...also dished out two assists and added one steal and one rebound...had a career-high 21 points, including five 3-pointers, against Duquesne...hit all four foul shots versus the Dukes and added two assists and two steals...against Coppin State, finished with six assists and five rebounds in 24 minutes...followed that outing with a 13-point, eight-assist performance against Central Connecticut State...hit 5-of-10 shots from the field and 2-for-2 from the foul line while adding a game-high three steals against the Blue Devils...finished with 14 points, four rebounds and four assists while playing all 40 minutes against Rutgers...hit all six of her free throws against the Scarlet Knights and added one steal...tallied nine points, six rebounds and six assists in 38 minutes against Hartford...finished with six points and five assists against Notre Dame...had six points, three assists and two rebounds at Boston College...has 247 career assists, ranking ninth on the school's all-time list.

## SOPHOMORE SEASON (2002-03)

Kunich started 24 games and was primarily used as the Panthers' point guard...was second on the team in assists with a 3.9 avg. (career-high 108 total) and averaged 6.9 points...led the team in free-throw shooting (93 percent)...was third in

minutes played (26.4 avg.)...had a career-high 14 assists in the Panthers' victory over Florida Atlantic...added 12 points on 5-of-7 shooting against the Owls and added four rebounds...dished out a game-high 10 assists in the win against Howard...tallied 16 points on two occasions this year...finished with 16 points, including a perfect 6 of 6 from the free-throw line, in the season-opening victory over Robert Morris...also tallied 16 markers on 6-of-11 shooting (55 percent) in the win against Eastern Kentucky...had a season-high four 3-pointers on five attempts versus Duquesne...had 13 points on 4-of-7 shooting at St. Francis (Pa.)...hit 6-of-9 shots, including 2 of 4 from behind the arc, for 15 points in the setback to Providence...also added five rebounds and three assists against the Friars...had 14 points and a career-high eight rebounds against Georgetown...hit 2-of-3 shots from behind the arc and made all four of her free throws against the Hoyas...also added four steals and three assists...had 19 points in the Panthers' setback to St. John's (Feb. 1)...hit 7-of-16 shots from the field, including three 3-pointers, and also added four assists, three rebounds and two steals in 39 minutes...had a game-high seven assists and finished with six points before fouling out against WVU...started the Big East Tournament game against Notre Dame and finished with seven points and three assists in 36 minutes...named to the Big East Academic All-Star Team.

## FRESHMAN SEASON (2001-02)

Kunich served primarily as a backup point guard to Laine Selwyn...was second on the team in assists (86) and third in 3-pointers (23)...tallied 13 assists against American in just her third collegiate game...that output was the fifth-best (tied) outing for a single game in school history and the most since Jo Jo Guzman dished out 13 against Coppin State on Dec. 26, 1996...her 13 assists ranked second (tied) in the NCAA that year...tallied nine assists

in two of the last three games (Rutgers and Seton Hall) of the year...tallied 13 points, including three 3-pointers, in the Panthers' near upset of Mississippi State in Cancun...also added four assists and three rebounds against the Bulldogs...led the team in scoring twice — at No. 1 Connecticut (11 points) and at No. 20 Boston College (10 points)...hit 3-of-8 shots from behind the arc against the Huskies and was 2-for-4 from three-point land against the Eagles.

## HIGH SCHOOL

Kunich led Oakland Catholic High School to three consecutive WPIAL Quad A championships (1999-01), as well as the Pennsylvania state title in 2001...a four-year starter and all-section honoree...scored 1,531 career points...averaged 14.1 points, 2.0 rebounds, 3.0 steals and 7.0 assists per game as a senior...was a first-team all-state honoree in her final season...named the Most Valuable Player of the 2001 Eat 'n Park Girls Roundball Classic...also earned the Special Performance Award by the Western PA Youth Basketball Club, Inc....averaged 10.6 points, 2.9 rebounds, 2.5 steals and a team-leading 7.0 assists per game as a junior...named to the *Pittsburgh Post-Gazette's* "Fab 5" three times and the *Tribune-Review's* "Terrific 10" twice...was honored as the Western Pennsylvania Basketball Club's Player of the Month three times and earned its Player of the Year award as a junior...earned recognition as a Scholar-Athlete in 2001 by the United States Army Reserve for outstanding academic and athletic excellence...a member of the President's Education Awards Program and recipient of the National Student-Athlete Day Award.
